

PASADENA FIELD RULES

BROOKSIDE 2:

- ⓐ **A BATTED BALL THAT ENDS UP IN THE PARKING LOT (BY ANY MEANS) IS A HOMERUN** – even on a bounce, even off a tree or light pole, AS LONG AS IT'S FAIR (a foul ball is just a foul ball)
- ⓑ **A BATTED BALL THAT ROLLS INTO THE PLAYGROUND AREA OR THE RIGHT FIELD BATHROOM AREA IS LIVE.**
- ⓒ **THERE ARE NO GROUND RULE DOUBLES** called on this field.

BROOKSIDE 3:

- ⓐ **A BATTED BALL THAT ENDS UP IN THE PARKING LOT (BY ANY MEANS) IS A HOMERUN** – even on a bounce, even off a tree or light pole, AS LONG AS IT'S FAIR (a foul ball is just a foul ball)
- ⓑ **A BATTED BALL HITTING THE RIGHT FIELD TREE IN “FAIR” TERRITORY IS A DEAD BALL-GROUND RULE DOUBLE** ~ HITTING THE TREE IN FOUL TERRITORY IS JUST FOUL. YOU CANNOT CATCH A FOUL BALL OUT OF THE TREE.

JEFFERSON:

- ⓐ **A BATTED BALL HIT OVER ANY OUTFIELD FENCE “FAIR-OR-FOUL” IS AN OUT.** If the ball hits a tree or a pole & goes OVER it is still OVER, and it's an OUT. If a batted ball hits a tree, or fence, or pole, or ANYTHING and lands back in FAIR PLAY the ball is LIVE.
- ⓑ **A BATTED BALL THAT FALLS THROUGH ANY HOLES IN THE OUTFIELD FENCING OR GETS STUCK IN THE OUTFIELD FENCING IS A DEAD BALL-GROUND RULE DOUBLE.** Umpire judgement will be used on whether a ball went over vs through a hole to determine OUT or DOUBLE.
- ⓒ **A BATTED BALL HITTING THE LEFT FIELD TREE IN “FAIR” TERRITORY IS A DEAD BALL-GROUND RULE DOUBLE** ~ HITTING THE TREE IN FOUL TERRITORY IS JUST FOUL. YOU CANNOT CATCH A FOUL BALL OUT OF THE TREE.
